CGC ahead of few IIT's and IIM's in B-School Ranking Category

In the recently released Top 100 Business Schools of India Ranking by Business Today, Chandigarh Business School of Administration, Chandigarh Group of Colleges, Landran has secured 51st rank Pan India in the category of Return of Investment. This has been followed by 60th rank gained by IIT Delhi, 61st by IIT Madras, 67th by IIM Kolkata, 79th by IIM Kashipur and 100th rank by IIM Indore in the similar category. The escalation in the ranking of CBSA as compared to last year which was, 76 has marked it at 12th position amongst the North zone colleges of the country. The overall ranking has also been improved from 196 last year to 173 this year.

Another Ranking by 'The Week' has also been released lately which has placed CGC at 27th in the Best B- School Private Ranking along with an overall rank of 105.

UK relaxing the Rules for International Students

Uni of Worcester soon to partner with CGC Landran

fter the UK Government announced the Post Study Work Visa for the International students which permit them to work for upto 2 years after completing their degrees, there has been a rapid increase in the intake of the international students. Earlier the graduates with bachelor's or master's degrees were allowed to work for only four months. This was stated by Head of International Partnerships, University of Worcester, John Gardener who was here at Chandigarh Group of Colleges, Landran. Such welcoming policies are bringing back the interest of international students in UK and also increasing their job prospects, he added.

The University of Worcester which welcomes more than 700 international students every year from 70 different nationalities has exchange Partners from USA, Europe, China, Australia, New Zealand, Japan is now foreseeing to become a partner with CGC. John encouraged Indian students to apply for the study



exchange programs wherein they would be enrolled with the University of Worcester after completing one year from the partner institute. He was accompanied by Anand Patil, Regional Manager, Middle East, North Africa & South Asia, University of Worcester.
